ReDressing Injustice is a collaborative art installation that generates public awareness about the hundreds of missing and murdered women from the Mexico/USA borderlands including Ciudad Juarez and Chihuahua City. The piece consists of hundreds of creatively altered dresses hanging from pink wooden crosses. Each dress forms part of a compelling visual testimony that conveys the complex political, social and emotional issues surrounding the disappearances of girls and women from the borderlands.



Join artist Irene Simmons of Arizona State University to create dresses for public display. Bring along a dress (new or used) and recycled or everyday materials found in your home. Glue guns, glue sticks, unusual materials (beads, buttons) are supplied. Scissors, an iron and fabric paint are also available.

This is a free, hands-on, workshop for all members of the community.
